

A LOCAL LAW to amend the Nassau County Administrative code in relation to issuance of appearance tickets by security personnel assigned to the Police Department's Public Security Unit.

Passed by the Nassau County Legislature on July 19, 2010

Became a law on July 21, 2010 with the approval of the Deputy County Executive acting on behalf of the County Executive.

BE IT ENACTED by the Nassau County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. Chapter XXII of the Nassau County Administrative code, as amended, is hereby further amended to add a new section 22-15.4 to read as follows:

§22-15.4 Security personnel of the Nassau County Police Department's Public Security Office are hereby authorized to issue appearance tickets for parking offenses which occur at County-owned or operated properties, for violations of Chapter XI-A of the Nassau County Administrative Code and violations of rules, regulations and ordinances relating to the use of the property or facilities under the jurisdiction of the Nassau County Department of Parks, Recreation and Museums. In addition, security


personnel of the Nassau County Police Department's Public Security Office classified as Public Safety Officer II and above are authorized to issue appearance tickets for parking offenses which occur anywhere within the geographical boundaries of Nassau County.

§2. Subsection 2 of section 2165 of Article XXI-C of the County Government Law of Nassau County, as amended by Local Law No. 21 – 2002, is hereby REPEALED.

§3. It is hereby determined, pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 8 N.Y.E.C.L. section 0101 et seq. and its implementing regulations, Part 617 of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., and Section 1611 of the County Government Law of Nassau County, that this local law is a "Type II" Action within the meaning of Section 617.5(c)(20) of 6 N.Y.C.R.R. ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment"), and, accordingly, is of a class of actions which do not have a significant effect on the environment; and no further review is required.

§4. Effective Date. This local law shall take effect immediately.
