## Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) Nassau County HOME Investment Partnership (HOME)-American Rescue Plan (ARP)

HOME-ARP funding was created to assist qualifying populations including individuals or households who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, and other vulnerable populations, by providing housing, rental assistance, supportive services, and non-congregate shelter, to reduce homelessness and increase housing stability across the country. These grant funds will be administered through HUD's HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME).

Nassau County plans to allocate \$6,913,488 of its HOME-ARP allocation to the development of affordable rental housing, with the goal of producing at least 20 housing units. Another \$597,107 will be allocated each towards supportive services and non-profit operating costs.

Nassau County plans to serve the population that meets the HOME-ARP Notice definitions of the homeless or at risk of homelessness Qualifying Populations and the subpopulations of homeless or at-risk elderly, and disabled persons. This preference will be designed so as to not violate any applicable fair housing, civil rights, and nondiscrimination requirements, including but not limited to those requirements listed in 24 CFR 5.105(a). The County will not limit eligibility to a particular Qualifying Population or subpopulation.
